Kamontae Cohen Nate Cousino


Whitmer High School had nine athletes qualify to compete at the Indoor State Track and Field Meet on March 4th and placed sixth as a team out of 66 teams. Kamontae and Nate took first place in their respective events.



Kamontae, a senior, won the state championship in the Triple Jump with a leap of 44 feet, 10 inches and won the event on his final attempt. Kamontae is also the school record holder in the triple jump. Nate, a junior, won the state championship in the 800 Meter Run with a time of 1 minute and 56 seconds. He took the lead in the final stretch and held on for the victory. Nate was also the anchor leg of the school record holding 4x800 meter relay team.

PROJECT UPDATES — Washington Local residents passed a 4.9-mill levy in 2014, with 0.6-mills designated for permanent improvement projects. The campaign for Issue 2 included 3 promises — elementary playground equipment, the replacement of portable units, and improvements to Edgar Street. New playground equipment was installed at the district's eight elementary schools in Fall, 2015,

and we just celebrated our building additions at Monac and McGregor elementary schools at dedications held over the past few weeks. Our next construction project is making improvements to Edgar Street. Plans include replacement of the existing alphalt on Edgar between Whitmer and Clegg drives, improvements to the street's drainage, new concrete sidewalk and curb, raised crosswalks at front and rear of Jefferson, and new decorative fencing. We also have plans to create a security vestibule at the main entrance of Whitmer High School. Advertisements began March 15th for bids on both projects which are due at noon on April 5th. Construction will be scheduled during the summer, after school is out.

NATIONAL SCHOLASTIC ART WINNER

In February, I had the pleasure of attending the Regional Scholastic Art Exhibition in Fort Wayne, Indiana, which featured 23 amazing works of art by Whitmer students. Thirteen pieces received Gold Keys and advanced to the national jurying. I am thrilled to share that **Andrea Matthews** received a National Gold Award and will be recognized at an awards event at Carnegie Hall in New York. Andrea is only a sophomore, and we look forward to her future creations.

POWER OF PEN STATE QUALIFIERS

Washington Local has two state qualifiers for Power of the Pen — Washington student **Ashley Carman** and Jefferson student **Morgan David**. Power of the Pen is an interscholastic middle school competition devoted to excellence in creative writing. WLS junior high students competed at district competition in

February and advanced to Regional Competition on March 2nd. Ashley placed 2nd among ALL eighth graders at the regional contest; both Ashley and Morgan qualified to compete at the state finals held at the College of Wooster in May. Our Power of the Pen team is advised by **Luke Fannin**, who teaches our iunior high LEAP gifted program.

Mr. Flemmings has held teaching, coaching, and leadership positions in the district at the elementary, junior high, and high school levels. He has served as Jackman head teacher, Junior High Athletic Director, and Acting Associate Principal at Jefferson. He is currently an Associate Principal at Whitmer and will finish out the school year there but will be communicating and learning from Mr. Magginis to provide a smooth transition of leadership at Monac.
