Wernert "Good Fit" Book Project Creates School-Business Collaboration

Wernert's unique school-wide project brought together Washington Local staff, older students at Whitmer, local businesses, and parents for the common goal of student literacy.

Principal Katherine Spenthoff and counselor Molly Mueller secured funding through fundraisers and partnerships with local businesses (Brondes Ford, Columbia Gas, and Graybar Electric) to take each of the elementary school's students on a field trip to Barnes and Noble to select *A Good Fit Book* for summer reading. The field trips were spread out over three days.

Volunteer mentors including WLS staff, students in Whitmer's Teaching Professionals career training program, Whitmer athletes, and community members were paired up with students. With the support of their adult buddies, each student selected a book to take home with them over the summer.

A Good Fit Book is part of the Café/Daily 5 Instructional process. An informational evening meeting allowed parents to learn about the project and the practice of selecting A Good Fit Book.

Students will be given a blank postcard that is stamped and addressed to Wernert. They will be asked to write about their books on the postcards and mail them back to the school during the summer. The postcards will be displayed at the school Open House in August when Wernert students will have the opportunity to trade their bought books in and pick out another book.
