Superintendent's Report & Communications Patrick Hickey, Superintendent

Top Workplaces Nominee -- Washington Local has been nominated as one of the best workplaces. Top Workplaces is an independent organization which lists the Top 150 companies to work for in the country. Over the last two years, only three K-12 schools have been nominated and accepted into Top Workplaces, and no Ohio school has ever been part of the Top 150. Each one of our staff members will be surveyed. Being nominated is a huge honor; to make the Top 150 would be ground-breaking.

Northwest Ohio Food Drive • September 16-20 -- Washington Local will be participating again with ProMedica, Anderson's, Buckeye Cable, and other big corporations in the Northwest Ohio Food Drive, September 16-20. Last year we donated more tons of food than any of these big corporations, which is pretty incredible when we have 57% of our families living in poverty.



WLS Receives "A" in Value Added -- As a District, Washington Local Schools earned an "A" in the category of Value Added. I think it's the most important metric -- moving kids more than a year of academic growth while they're here. I would also like to recognize the following schools who achieved an "A" in Value Added: Monac, McGregor, Wernert, Jefferson, and Washington. The kits cost approximately \$8.00 to assemble. Abby set a goal of making 200 kits and was seeking donations over the summer.


