

Special Recognition: UT Engineering Contest Winning Team

Congratulations to the team of four Whitmer students from Jason Rubley's honors physics class, who won the University of Toledo Engineering Design Challenge Competition --Thomas Wrede, Micayla Moldenke, Alley Rose, and Luke Walling.

Three of the students are also seniors in the Engineering program at Whitmer's Career & Technology Center.



The challenge required each team to design a device that would carry washers across a distance of approximately 8 feet when launched into the air. The washers were launched using alka seltzer in water to build pressure in a sealed container.

Most high schools in northwest Ohio sent 2 to 4 teams. This Whitmer team won against approximately 50 area high school teams by delivering 40 washers over a 5-minute time period. The second place team wasn't even close, with just 23 washers. We are very proud of the exceptional work of our students.

ADMINISTRATOR ANNOUNCEMENTS

Katie Spenthoff, our Washington Principal, is moving to the Administration Building to be our new Director of Curriculum and Instruction. She has served as a fifth grade teacher at Hiawatha, a language arts teacher at Jefferson, and Associate Principal at Jefferson, Wernert Elementary Principal, and Washington Principal since Fall, 2013. We look forward to Mrs. Spenthoff joining us here at Lincolnshire.

Replacing Mrs. Spenthoff at Washington will be **Jennifer Bronikowski**, our current Washington Associate Principal. RETIREMENTS

William Magginis, Monac Elementary Principal, is retiring in June with 38 years. Mr. Magginis was hired in 1979 and taught grades 4-7 at Horace Mann, Wernert, Trilby, and Greenwood Elementary schools before being named Greenwood Principal in 1997. He has served as Monac Principal since Fall, 2007.
