## REMEMBERING FRANK ERME october 18, 1928- Febrraay 13, 2016



In his 87 years on this earth, 63 of those years were dedicated to the Washington Local Schools. Frank's love and devotion to our district and our high school earned him the nickname "Mr. Whitmer."

Frank began his career in Washington Local in 1952 as a social studies teacher. He served as a teacher, coach, dean, associate principal and athletic director at Whitmer for more than 30 years. Three years after retirement, he was appointed to the WLS Board of Education on which he served 16 years, including terms as President and Vice-President.

Few people might remember Frank's hand in having a track installed at the stadium. In 1972, as Athletic Director, Frank made plans for an allweather track at Whitmer Memorial Stadium. At that time, the athletic department received no funding from the district, and the project would exceed the dollars in the athletic budget. Frank contacted businesses and acquaintances, friends and alumni, and had much of the labor and materials for the track donated. The Athletic Boosters organized a donation drive that netted $\$ 22,000$ toward the track construction. The final cost to the district was $\$ 32,000$.

Frank and his late wife, Nancy, dedicated themselves to Whitmer athletics. The Nancy Erme Relays were named in her memory and Quast Field was renamed Frank Erme Field in 1989. Frank was inducted into the Findlay University Hall of Fame in 1978 and into the State of Ohio Athletic Director's Hall of Fame in 1990. He also received the National Football Foundation Distinguished Service Award in 2007.

While Washington Local has lost a wonderful man and a true gentleman, I am comforted to know that Frank is in a much better place and that he is reunited with his wife, Nancy. May he rest in peace.
