Attached you will find quotes from two dealers on three maintenance/plow trucks and one van for transporting staff/students. I am recommending we purchase all four vehicles from Bronde's for \$100,722. Kistler Ford did not submit a quote even after several e-mails and phone-calls.

You may note that these trucks are not equipped with utility boxes. If this package is approved we will be getting pick-up trucks with a cab only. Cobra Truck and Fabrication will be installing one new utility box, and swapping two other utility boxes from our old trucks to the new trucks. Jay and I would like Cobra to perform the additional work necessary to swap the plowing and salting accessories, and install new flatbeds. This additional work is very specialized and will require a firm that has a history with our vehicles, and has the patience and the ability to communicate with us properly.

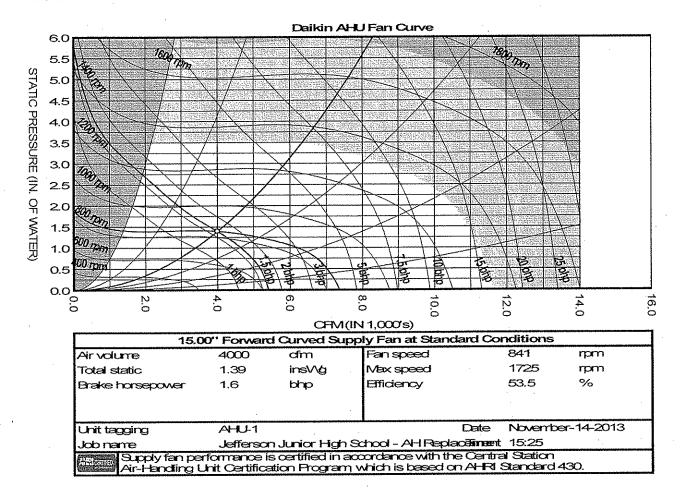

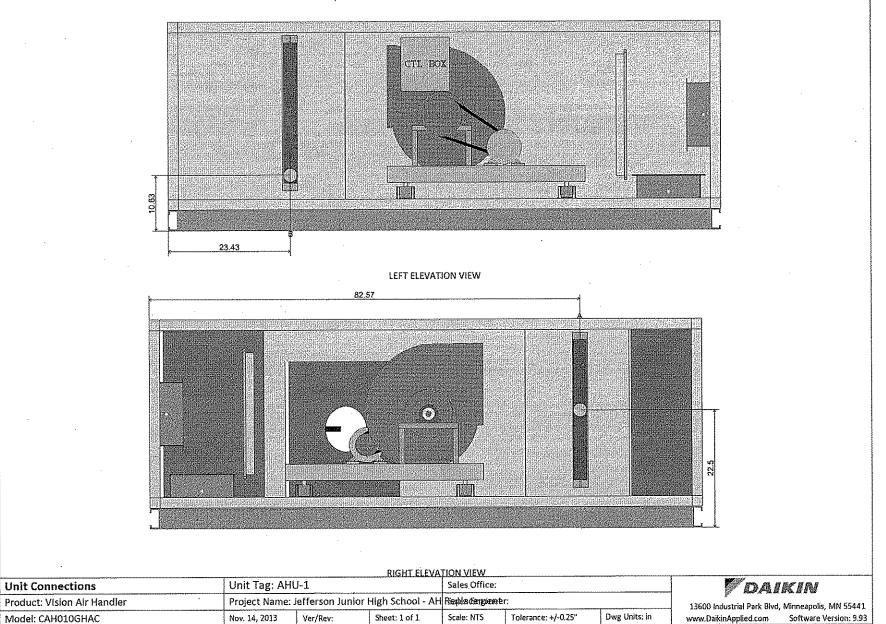

WHITMER HIGH SCHOOL MEMORIAL STADIUM SCOREBOARD ADVERTISING AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, the Board owns and operates a scoreboard located on the premises of its High School football field (hereinafter referred to as "Scoreboard"); and

WHEREAS, the Scoreboard contains a certain amount of space available for advertising purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Advertising Entity desires to rent from the Board a portion of the Scoreboard's advertising space pursuant to the terms and conditions set forth below; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to rent to the Advertising Entity a portion of the Scoreboard's advertising space pursuant to the terms and conditions set forth below.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises and mutual agreements contained herein, the parties hereby agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Advertising Space</u>: The Board hereby grants to the Advertising Entity a limited right to place an advertisement on a 5 ft. 4 in. x 6 ft. 4 in. section of the Scoreboard.
- 2. <u>Advertisement Term</u>: The Advertising Entity's advertisement shall be displayed on the Scoreboard for a period of five (5) years, commencing on August 1, 2014, and ending on July 31, 2019.
- 3. Rental Price: The Advertising Entity shall pay \$25,000.00 to the Board as rent for the advertising space, payable in five (5) equal installments of \$5,000.00 per year. All rental payments shall be made by check payable to Washington Local Board of Education on or before August 15 of the year in which they are due, beginning August 15, 2014.
- 4. <u>Advertisement Contents</u>: The content and appearance of the Advertising Entity's advertisement shall be subject to the Board's approval, and the Board possesses the absolute right to disapprove all or part of the advertisement. Without limiting the foregoing, advertisements of a political or religious nature, or those that promote the sale or use of alcohol or tobacco, shall not be approved.
- 5. <u>Advertisement Design</u>: The Advertising Entity shall provide its advertisement to the school district and all costs associated with the design, construction, and display of the advertisement shall be the sole responsibility of the Advertising Entity.
- 6. <u>Changes to Advertisement</u>: Changes to the Advertising Entity's advertisement shall be subject to the Board's approval. All costs associated with any such changes shall be the sole responsibility of the Advertising Entity.
- 7. <u>Default</u>: In the event that the Advertising Entity breaches any provision of this Agreement, the Board may immediately terminate this Agreement and the Advertising Entity, in addition to being responsible for all damages incurred as a result of said breach, shall pay to the Board all reasonable costs incurred by the Board in connection with the designing, constructing, and displaying of a replacement advertisement.

WHITMER HIGH SCHOOL MEMORIAL STADIUM SCOREBOARD ADVERTISING AGREEMENT

- 8. <u>Damage to Scoreboard</u>: In the event the Scoreboard is damaged by a casualty beyond the Board's control, including but not limited to fire, explosion, water, act of God, civil disorder or disturbance, labor dispute, vandalism, war, riot, sabotage, weather or energy-related closing, governmental regulations, or other similar causes, the Board shall have the option of either repairing the damage or terminating this Agreement without incurring any future liability. If the Board exercises its right to terminate this Agreement, the rental provided for herein shall then be accounted for by and between the Board and the Advertising Entity up to the time the Scoreboard was damaged, with the Advertising Entity paying rentals for the time up to such date and the Board refunding rentals collected for the time beyond such date.
- 9. Additional Advertising: The advertising entity shall be entitled to place a video advertisement on the Scoreboard during varsity sporting events at no extra charge. The Advertising Entity shall provide the video advertisement to the Board in advance for its approval. The video advertisement will be played three times during each sporting event, which shall include pregame and post-game time. The Advertising Entity shall also be entitled to a full-page advertisement in the Whitmer High School Athletic Program for each fall and winter season during the term of this Agreement at no extra charge. The Advertising Entity shall provide the program advertisement to the Board in advance for its approval prior to the regular submission deadline for program advertisements.
- 10. <u>Independent Contractor Status</u>: Each party hereto shall be deemed an independent contractor, and neither party is nor shall be considered an agent, employee, or representative of the other.
- 11. <u>Compliance With Law</u>: Both parties shall comply with all applicable, federal, state, and local laws, ordinances, codes, regulations, and policies.
- 12. No Waiver: No failure of either party to exercise any power reserved to it by this Agreement or to insist upon strict compliance by the other party with any obligation or condition hereunder and no custom or practice of the parties at variance with the terms hereof shall constitute a waiver of either party's right to demand strict compliance with any of the terms of this Agreement. Waiver by either party of any particular default shall not affect or impair either party's right to exercise any or all of its rights and powers herein, nor shall that constitute a waiver by that party of any right hereunder, or of its right upon any subsequent breach or default to terminate this Agreement prior to the expiration of its term.
- 13. <u>Amendment</u>. This Agreement may not be reformed, altered, or modified in any way by any practice or course of dealing, but may be modified or amended only by an instrument in writing duly executed by both parties.

3170 - SUBSTANCE ABUSE

It is the policy of the Board to provide a safe working environment free of drugs and alcohol that may adversely affect the workplace.

Drugs and Alcohol

As a condition of employment with the Board, no Board employee shall unlawfully use, sell, distribute, dispense, manufacture, or have in his or her possession any drug while engaged in Board business, no matter the location. Violation may result in immediate termination of employment.

Prescription or over-the-counter drug use must be within the limits of a valid prescription and/or manufacturer's guidelines. Such use must not adversely impair the individual's ability to function safely and effectively or adversely affect judgment or perception.

Off-the-job possession, sale, use or involvement with illegal drugs (or alcohol) which leads to adverse publicity, or impacts the Board's credibility with any outside concern, or has the potential for that publicity or impact, as determined solely by the Board, will be dealt with on an individual case-by-case basis.

Unauthorized alcohol possession or consumption while conducting Board business, on Board-owned or controlled property, or in Board-owned, controlled, or rented vehicles is prohibited.

Additionally, Board employees are not to be at work while under the influence of alcohol, an illegal drug, or a legal drug if illegally acquired and/or used.

Procedure

The Board reserves the right to investigate potential violations of this policy in a reasonable manner, including

- A. Observing behavior and performance;
- B. Requiring individual alcohol/drug testing upon reasonable suspicion of a violation of this policy; and
- C. Undertaking property searches.

The Board reserves the right to search, at any time and for any reason, any and all lockers, desks, storage drawers and cabinets, office cubicles, and any other work areas provided by the Board, all of which remain the Board property at all times. In addition, the Board reserves the right to search vehicles brought onto the Board property (including parking lots) as well as outer garments, purses, handbags, knapsacks and the like, when it has a reasonable basis for doing so and the search is reasonable in its scope.

Anything uncovered in a search and suspected of being a drug or alcohol may be confiscated until ownership and/or composition is determined. Where warranted, confiscated items may be turned over to appropriate law enforcement authorities.

Testing

1. Applicants

All offers of employment with the Board may be conditioned upon the applicant's successful completion of an alcohol/drug test. The costs of the test will be paid for by the Board. The applicant may request a confirmatory test if the initial test is positive. Any person denied employment because of a positive drug test may not be considered for employment for a period of at least six months after the last test.

2. Employees

Employees shall be required to submit to "reasonable suspicion" alcohol/drug testing. "Reasonable suspicion" testing is premised on a reasonable belief that the employee is under the influence of drugs or alcohol in violation of this policy. Reasonable belief may be based upon, among other things, observation, deterioration in work performance, or erratic behavior.

The cost of alcohol/drug tests is paid for by the Board. A confirmatory test is performed if the initial test is positive.

Corrective Action

Corrective action up to and including termination of employment may be taken with respect to any Board employee who:

- Refuses to sign an applicable release form;
- Fails to complete an alcohol/drug test;
- Attempts to interfere with the integrity of the test (e.g., produce a diluted test result);
- Produces test results that indicate the presence of drugs or
- alcohol above pre-determined levels (.02 alcohol blood level at time of testing), or the illegal use of drugs; or
- Fails to seek rehabilitation treatment as a condition of continued employment, if permitted by the Board.

The Board reserves the right to take any corrective action, up to and including termination, whenever the Board determines in its sole discretion that such discipline is appropriate in light of the consequence to the Board of an employee's use of alcohol or drugs.

Confidentiality

All test results will be provided to Director of Human Resources, who will notify only those Board employees with a need to know about the test results. The Board will make a reasonable effort to treat the test results as confidential medical records, but the Board has no liability to an applicant or any Board employees as a result of any disclosure of such test results. Test results are maintained in the employee's medical file.

Employee Assistance

The Board of Education recognizes alcoholism and drug abuse as treatable illnesses. When such illnesses impair the performance of **an employee** classified staff, the Board recognizes the responsibility to assist in the treatment of those illnesses.

A classified staff member having an illness or other problem relating to the use of alcohol or other drugs will receive the same careful consideration and offer of assistance that is presently extended to classified staff having any other illness.

The responsibility to correct unsatisfactory job performance or behavior resulting from a suspected health problem rests with the classified staff member. Failure to do so, for whatever reason, will result in appropriate corrective or disciplinary action as determined by the Board.

If a classified staff member voluntarily requests counseling or assistance before the Board learns of the classified staff member's substance abuse problem (through a positive test result or otherwise), the classified staff member's job security or promotion opportunities will not be jeopardized by his/her request for counseling or referral assistance. A support staff member may not avoid the consequences of a positive test by requesting counseling or assistance for a substance abuse problem after being instructed to submit to a drug test.

Classified **sS**taff who suspect they may have an alcoholism or other drug abuse problem are encouraged to seek counseling and information on a confidential basis by contacting resources available for such service.

3215 - USE OF TOBACCO BY PROFESSIONAL STAFF

The Board of Education recognizes that the use of tobacco presents a health hazard which can have serious consequences for the user and the nonuser.

The Board of Education is committed to providing students, staff, and visitors with a tobacco and smoke-free environment. The negative health effects of tobacco use for both users and nonusers, particularly in connection with second hand smoke, are well established. Further, providing non-smoking and a tobacco-free environment is consistent with the responsibilities of teachers and staff to be our positive role models for students.

For purposes of this policy, "use of tobacco" shall mean all uses of tobacco, means to chew or maintain any substance containing tobacco, including smokeless tobacco, in the mouth to derive the effects of tobacco, as well as all uses of tobacco, or tobacco substitutes, including a cigar, cigarette, pipe tobacco, chewing tobacco, snuff, or any other matter or substances that contain tobacco, in addition to papers used to roll cigarettes and/or smoking of electronic, "vapor," or other substitute forms of cigarettes, clove cigarettes and any other lighted smoking devices for burning tobacco or any other substances.

In order to protect students and staff who choose not to **smoke or** use tobacco from an environment noxious to them, and because the Board cannot, even by indirection, condone the use of tobacco, does not condone smoking or the use of tobacco, the Board prohibits the use of tobacco or tobacco substitute products by professional staff members at all times in the school buildings, board owned vehicles and/or stands at athletic facilities, and any building or facility designated as a non-smoking area in the future within any enclosed facility owned or leased or contracted for by the Board, and in areas directly or indirectly under the control of the Board immediately adjacent to locations of ingress or egress to such facilities. This prohibition extends to any Board-owned and/or operated vehicles used to transport students and to all other Board-owned and/or operated vehicles. Such prohibition also applies to school grounds, any school-related event, and in designated areas as defined in statute and by Ohio's Smoke-Free Workplace Program.

5113.01 - INTRA-DISTRICT TRANSFERS

In compliance with State law, the Washington Local Board of Education will permit parents/guardians, who are district residents, to apply for student attendance at their schools of choice within the District, based upon established criteria. Preference will be given to students living in the prescribed attendance area over intra-district transfers.

To request intra-district enrollment consideration, parents/guardians must complete an application by the established deadline. If the request is approved, student transportation is the responsibility of the parent. Approval for intra-district enrollment will be granted for one (1) full school year **and reviewed annually.**

Transfer decisions will be based on building and grade level capacities; special education decisions will be based upon State regulations. Consideration will be given to maintaining racial balance as required by law when intra-district enrollment decisions are made. Approval for intradistirict enrollment will be granted for one full school year; all approvals are to be reviewed annually.

Building capacity is determined by using the number of classrooms assigned for regular K-6 instruction, times twenty-five. Enrollment levels are set at two (2) less than the State-required average of twenty-five (25) for the primary grades (K-3), and at the State-required average of twenty-five (25) for the immediate grades (4-6). Special education program enrollment is set at three (3) less than the limits established by State laws and regulations.

5460 - GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

It shall be the policy of the Board of Education to acknowledge each student's successful completion of the instructional program appropriate to the achievement of District goals and objectives as well as personal proficiency by the awarding of a diploma at fitting graduation ceremonies.

The Board shall award a regular high school diploma to every student enrolled in this District who meets the requirements of graduation established by this Board or who properly completes the goals and objectives specified in his/her individualized education program (I.E.P.) including either the exemption from or the requirement to complete the achievement tests required by the State Board of Education in order to graduate. Each student must also demonstrate, unless exempted, at least a proficient level of skill on the achievement tests required by the State Board to graduate.

The requirements for graduation from high school include earning twenty-five(25) units of credit in grades nine through twelve as follows. Students under an IEP may receive a diploma under the alternative pathway to graduation as defined by ORC 3313.603 with the approval of the IEP team, high school principal, and director of student services.

Credit may be earned by:

- A. completing coursework;
- B. testing out of or demonstrating mastery of course content; or
- C. pursuing one or more educational options in accordance with the District's Credit Flexibility Program.

Credit may be earned at an accredited postsecondary institution.

Every high school may permit students below the ninth grade to take advanced work for credit. This work shall count toward the graduation requirements if it was both:

- A. taught by a person who possesses a license/certificate issued under State law that is valid for teaching high school;
- B. designated by the Board as meeting the high school curriculum requirements.

An honors diploma shall be awarded to any student who meets the established requirements for graduation or the requirements of his/her I.E.P.; attains the applicable scores on the achievement tests required by the State Board of Education for graduation; and meets any additional criteria the State Board may establish.

Commencement exercises will include only those students who have successfully completed requirements for graduation as certified by the high school principal. No student who has completed the requirements for graduation shall be denied a diploma as a disciplinary measure. A student may be denied participation in the ceremony of graduation when personal conduct so warrants.

The Superintendent shall establish whatever administrative guidelines are necessary to comply with State rules and regulations.

5530 - ALCOHOL, DRUG, TOBACCO USE AND PREVENTION

The Board of Education recognizes that the use and the misuse of alcohol, drugs, tobacco are serious problems with legal, physical, and social implications.

Covered under this policy:

- A. all dangerous controlled substances as so designated and/or prohibited by Ohio statute;
- B. all chemicals substances which release toxic, intoxicating, or mood-altering vapors;
- C. all alcoholic beverages (being under the influence is understood to include the prevalent odor of alcohol);
- D. any prescription or patent drug, except those for which permission to use in school has been granted pursuant to Board policy;
- E. anabolic steroids;
- F. any substance that is a "look-alike" to any of the above;
- G. tobacco products and alternative nicotine products.

The Board prohibits the use, possession, concealment, or distribution of **any of the above substances**, **or any** drug or any drug-related paraphernalia as defined by law, or the misuse use, possession, **concealment**, **or distribution** of a product containing a substance that can provide an intoxicating or mood-altering effect while on school grounds, on school vehicles and/or at any school-sponsored event.

Guidelines shall be developed for the identification, amelioration, and regulation of drug use in the schools. Such guidelines shall:

- A. emphasize the prevention of drug, alcohol, and tobacco use;
- B. provide for a comprehensive, age-appropriate, drug and alcohol education and prevention program which:
 - addresses the legal, social, psychological, and health consequences of drug, tobacco, and alcohol use:
 - provides information about effective techniques for resisting peer pressure to use illicit drugs and alcohol;
 - assists students in developing skills to make responsible decisions about substance abuse and other important health issues;
 - 4. promotes positive emotional health, self-esteem, and respect for one's body;
 - 5. meets the minimal objectives as stated in the essential performance objectives for health education as established by the State Department of Education;
- C. include a procedure for informing students that the use of illicit drugs and the unlawful

- possession and use of alcohol is wrong and harmful;
- D. provide standards of conduct that are applicable to all students and which clearly prohibit, at a minimum, the unlawful possession, use, or distribution of illicit drugs and alcohol by students on school premises or as a part of any school activity;
- E. include a clear statement that disciplinary sanctions, up to and including expulsion and referral for prosecution, will be imposed on students who violate the school standards of conduct and a description of those sanctions;
 - The sanctions may include, together with punitive action, voluntary referral to appropriate persons or agencies for screening and assessment. Such referral may only be made to qualified and properly licensed individuals or programs.
- provide information about any drug and alcohol counseling and rehabilitation and reentry programs available to students and provide procedures to direct students and their parents/guardians to the appropriate programs;
- G. require that all parents/guardians and students be given a copy of the standards of conduct regarding the unlawful possession, use, or distribution of illicit drugs and alcohol by students;
- H. require the notification to parents and students that compliance with the standards of conduct is mandatory;
- I. provide a periodic review of the District's program to determine its effectiveness and implement changes as needed and to ensure that disciplinary sanctions are consistently enforced;
- J. establish means for dealing with students suspected of drug use or suspected of possessing or distributing drugs in school and ensure that the District's policy and administrative guidelines on Search and Seizure (5771), Suspension and Expulsion (5610), and Permanent Exclusion (5610.01) are complied with fully.

In order to protect students and staff, the Board prohibits the possession, consumption, purchase or attempt to purchase and/or use of tobacco products **or alternative nicotine products** by students in school buildings, on school grounds, on school vehicles, and at any interscholastic competition, extra curricular event, or other school-sponsored activity. The safety and security of our staff and students is our top priority at Whitmer High School. We want to know who is parking on our campus each day. It has come to the attention of the Whitmer administration and the Department of Safety and Security that parking privileges are being abused by many students. Currently students register their cars at no cost and are given a sticker which is placed in the back right hand corner of the window. Under the current registration program it is difficult to identify who is parked on our campus. Often the stickers don't stick on the windows, cannot be seen due to tinted window, or cannot be moved to another car if the student drives a different car for the day. The administrative team has developed a proposal to address these issues and to increase security measures by being able to quickly identify cars that belong to our students and staff.

The plan for Whitmer is to charge \$10 for a yearly permit issued in the first semester or \$5 for students who register for a permit during the second semester. All faculty and staff will be required to register their cars and receive a free permit. Each parking permit will have an identification number and will hang from the rearview mirror. Parking will be monitored by Campus Security and the Criminal Justice program. Any student who is found to be illegally parked, or who has parked without a permit, will be subject to a progressive discipline policy that ranges from a warning to placing a boot on the vehicle. The details of this procedure will be outlined in the student handbook and the parking permit registration form. See attached handbook language.

Although student's vehicles have been registered at Whitmer since 2010, monitoring of parking has not been consistent on campus. Our Safety and Security department understands the importance of being able to quickly identify cars that belong to our students and staff and those that don't. The current proposal not only outlines the rules for student parking, but also provides the consequences for not abiding by those rules. The administrative team hopes to implement this program in the fall of the 2014 school year.

Current Guidelines

Student Parking — All vehicles parked on school grounds must be registered with the Discipline Center. All registered vehicles must display a current permit on the lower driver's side corner of the rear window. All students parking on school property, during the period commencing, one-half hour prior to opening of school, and ending one-half hour after closing of school, must park in those areas designated for student parking. The areas designated for student parking are the parking lots across from Washington and Jefferson Junior High, on Whitmer Drive. The parking spaces along Clegg Drive, the CTC parking lot, and the parking lot between the field house and the bleachers, are designated as Staff Parking. Improper student parking will result in disciplinary action and possible towing of the student's motor vehicle at the student's expense. Unsafe operation of any motor vehicle upon school property may result in immediate forfeiture of student parking privileges and may also result in the arrest of the offender(s). Proof of theft from, or damage to a teacher's or a student's motor vehicle, will result in disciplinary action and may result in expulsion from school and possible arrest.

Proposed Guidelines

Whitmer Handbook Student Parking

- Parking on Washington Local property is a privilege, not a right. The school reserves the right to search vehicles parked on school property. The areas designated for student parking are the parking lots across from Washington and Jefferson Junior High, on Whitmer Drive. Bicycles should be securely locked in the bicycle racks provided. The District will not be responsible for motor vehicles or contents which are lost, stolen, or damaged, or theft of, or damage to bicycles. All vehicles parked on school grounds must be registered with the Attendance and Resource Center.
- 1. All registered vehicles must display a current permit from the rear view mirror.
- 2. All students must park in areas designated for student parking from 7:00 a.m. until 3:15 p.m.
- 3. The parking spaces along Clegg Drive and Edgar Drive, the CTC parking lot, and the parking lot between the field house and the bleachers, are designated as Staff Parking. Improper student parking will result in disciplinary action, forfeiture of parking permit, and possible towing of the student's motor vehicle at the student's expense.
- 4. Unsafe operation of any motor vehicle on or near school property may result in immediate forfeiture of student parking privileges and may also result in ticketing or the arrest of the offender(s).
- 5. Parking permits will cost \$10 if purchased during the first semester or \$5 if purchased during the second semester.
- 6. The Security and Safety Department in collaboration with the Criminal Justice program will monitor student parking.
- 7. A progressive discipline system will be implemented for parking violations that consists of:

1st offense – warning

2nd offense – after school detention

3rd offense – Tuesday School

4th offense– loss of permit and the privilege to park on campus for two weeks

5th offense – revoke permit and the privilege to park on campus for 30 days

*The student may purchase a new permit for \$20 after the 30 days

6th offense and beyond- Could result in booting of car, and loss of parking privilege, tickets and additional fines.

- 8. A progressive discipline system will be implemented for parking without a permit that consists of:
 - 1st offense- warning and directed to purchase a permit
 - 2nd offense-ASD and required to purchase a permit with a violation fee for \$20
 - 3rd offense and beyond will be subject to a car boot and a boot removal fee totaling \$50

Parking Fee Structure:

Permit \$10/year or \$5 after first semester

Permit with violation fee \$20

Permit with violation fee and boot removal fee \$50
