## NINTH-GRADE PROFIGIENGY TEST RESULTS

## STATE PROFIGIENGY TESTS - DISTRIGT RESULTS

Proficiency tests are given each year to Ohio students in grades $4,6,9$ and 12 to test their knowledge and skills in core subject areas. Students have multiple opportunities between grades 8 and 12 to pass Ohio's Ninth Grade Proficiency Tests, which are a requirement for graduation.

## All Students
