

Senior Cosmetology Syllabi

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Prerequisites: Complete Junior Cosmetology

Course Description: Cosmetology II is the second year of a two year course to train students to become proficient in all required skills of cosmetology. Those include basic manipulative skills, Safety/sanitation, theory knowledge, Proper work habits, and a professional attitude necessary to be able to obtain licensure as well as be employed in an entry-level position in Cosmetology or a related field. This course enables the student to sit for the Ohio State Board of Cosmetology exam at the completion of training having obtained a total of 1500 hours; the current value of this licensure is \$23,000 if attending a private school after graduation.

Objectives: The student will perform work safety/sanitation practices according to the State Board of Cosmetology. The student will practice all skills learned in Junior Cosmetology. The senior class will consistently prepare for State Board which will include both theory and clinic. Senior year Cosmetology students will have the opportunity to work in a simulated salon atmosphere, including performing services on clients improving their overall image, learning to schedule appointments and the importance of retail recommendations as well as various forms of business building.

The senior student will also complete a comprehensive project in which they will be expected to create a salon from the ground up, including a profit and loss statement, loans, salon layout etc.

Attendance Policy: Good attendance is imperative to this program; monthly hour submissions will be made for each individual student to State Board. Any student absences totaling five days per qtr, in two consecutive quarters will be removed from the program. There will be no possibility of them obtaining the hours necessary nor the training expected.

Skills USA: Skills USA is a student leadership and competition organization to which the Cosmetology Major belongs and all Cosmetology students are expected to participate (the fee is \$15.50).

Course Evaluation: 40% Clinic, 40% classroom 20% employability (subject to change)

Tentative outline: Artificial Nails, Facials/Makeup/Skin diseases and disorders, Wigs/Braids, Anatomy, Electricity, employability and Salon Business.

Course Materials: Milady as well as Salon Fundamentals textbooks will be used, along with technology, Ohio means jobs, Today's Class.

The students are to provide payment for their kit prior to receiving as, well as their own uniform that is to be worn daily.
