Dear Parent or Guardian:

I am excited for the 2018-19 school year and look forward to teaching your son/daughter! This is my twelfth year teaching at Whitmer High School with five years of experience working in business. I hold a Bachelor's degree in International Business and a Master's degree in Spanish/Curriculum and Instruction from the University of Toledo. I look forward to bringing my experiences to the classroom and anticipate an exciting and productive school year!

In a foreign language class, students are assessed in the areas of listening, reading, writing, speaking, and culture. All students will be given a communication grade because active listening and speaking is integral to the success of mastering a language. If a student is absent, this may reflect in his/her grade. Participation cannot occur if a student is not in class.

Learning Goals

In this Spanish level 3 class, you will build on your previous knowledge of Spanish from level 1 and 2, and increase your fluency in the areas of reading, writing, speaking, and listening. You will expand your vocabulary and will be able to communicate in the present, past and future tense forms of Spanish. You will also develop a better understanding of the similarities and differences of cultures and languages.

Course Materials: We use a variety of supplemental materials to support our course studies, as well as short novels.

Over the course of the semester we will read one or two novels (time permitting). You will be responsible for the reader. If you lose the reader, you will be responsible for replacing it.

Grading

Class assignments, homework, quizzes, tests and projects = 80% Communication grade = 20% Final Exam = 15% of overall grade

Communication Grade

All students begin with a 70 point communication grade or a "C" however, students have the opportunity to receive a total of 100 communication points.

1 point or an "estrella" (star) may be awarded if a student answers a challenging question or answers a question in Spanish. A 1 point deduction called a "págame" (pay me) will be deducted when students are not following along or when answering

in English if the answer could have been answered in Spanish. The communication grade accounts for 20% of the overall class grade. Students are required to keep track of their points. If the teacher notices that you are not keeping track of your daily points, you will receive a double infraction. If you lose your págame/estrella paper, it will result in a 5 point deduction.

Late work

Late work is accepted only if the entire assignment has been completed. Half credit will then be given based on the percentage received on the assignment.

Homework will be assigned 2-3 days a week.
