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Prerequisite: French I

Course Description:

This course is designed to review and expand on basic French. Students will learn to speak, write, read, and understand basic French vocabulary through role-playing, skits, partner dialogues, and other activities.

Textbook(s):

Discovering French Nouveau by Valette Valette, Blaine Ray materials, and Tripp's Scripts used as a reference

Materials Needed:

- Blue, Black, Red Pens
- Pencils
- Paper
- Folder dedicated to French class

Grading Policy:

Students will be graded on class activities, homework, projects, quizzes, tests, and participation in partner conversations. Students' final grades will be based on quizzes, unit tests, homework, workbook assignments, projects, and the final exam. The **FINAL EXAM** counts for 15% of the students' total grade.

Homework Policy:

Students will be expected to complete various homework assignments ranging from readings in the text to writing papers. Students will have until the next school day to finish assignments, **UNLESS** it is a lengthier assignment.
