ACT

As directed by the State of Ohio, the ACT will be given to all juniors on Wednesday, March 15th. Junior students will come to school at the regular time, have the opportunity to eat a free breakfast, and take the ACT. Students will be released at Noon for testers with no accommodations and at 1:00 for students who have accommodations on the ACT. Our busses will pick juniors up and bring them home.

Students who are not taking the ACT (9th, 10, and 12th grade students) will not report to school on Wednesday, March 15th as all teachers are assigned to administer the ACT.

PreACT

Sophomores at Whitmer High School can take the PreACT free of charge. The test will be held on March 15, 2023 from 8:00-12:30. This Google Form is due by February 28, 2023. By completing and submitting this form, you will be registered for the PreACT.

Students will report to school at the usual time and testing will begin promptly at 8:00. Morning and midday busing will be provided. Free breakfast will be available for all students and lunches will be available for purchase.

Social Worker Snapshot Marijuana Use

Marijuana-is it safe? Is it addictive? What is the big deal? So much has changed over the years about the potency, availability and ways to use marijuana. Questions will continue about this drug and its safety but we do have clear information that is important to consider for our students and the potential dangers. Unfortunately, reports are showing a rise in the use of marijuana with youth. This trend is a concern as our students are in key developmental stages of their brain. Research is showing potential lifelong consequences to youth marijuana use. As parents/guardians it is important to be aware of the signs of substance abuse and know where to find help. - -Low energy
- -Depressed mood

March is National Nutrition Month

March is National Nutrition Month! This month was established to encourage people to choose healthy food choices and engage in regular physical activity. The Center for Disease Control (CDC) correlates healthy eating and regular physical activity with proper adolescent growth and development and prevention of obesity, cavities, iron deficiency, and



osteoporosis. In addition, healthy behaviors are associated with improved brain functioning (especially memory), reduced absenteeism, and improved mood.

The CDC has found that most U.S. youths don't eat the recommended daily servings of fruits and vegetables or whole grains and eat more than the daily recommended amounts of sodium. In addition, empty calories from added sugars and fats account for 40% of the calories adolescents consume daily. According to the CDC, adolescents drink more full-calorie soda daily than milk!

Some health tips the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics have outlined to help guide you and your family toward a healthy lifestyle include:

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- · make half your plate fruits and vegetables
- · watch portion sizes
- be active and engage in at least 30 minutes of activity five times per week
- · have healthy snacks readily available
- · read food labels
- · cook nutritious meals at home instead of eating out
- · adopt a family meal time
- · drink more water
- explore new foods and flavors.

JUNIORS! Meningococcal Vaccine Requirement!

PARENTS OF JUNIORS!: It is a state requirement in Ohio that all incoming seniors receive their meningococcal A, C, W, Y vaccine (MCV4-Menactra or Menveo) or booster sometime <u>after</u> their sixteenth birthday but <u>before</u> they enter their senior year of high school. Please send me a copy of your child's updated immunizations after they receive their vaccine so that I can record your child as being complete for this requirement. The Toledo Lucas County Health Department (TLCHD) holds vaccination clinics at various locations, most by appointment only. The clinic appointment line number is (419) 213-2884. You will need to leave a message and the nurse will call you to arrange an appointment. The TLCHD requires that you bring a copy of your child's immunization record to the clinic. Illness/injury procedure

Students that are ill during the school day and need an early excusal should come to the nurse's office to evaluate their symptoms. If your child texts you to pick them up for illness, for the **sake of student safety and to save you time**, please remind them to go through the nurse and wait for me to call you. I will evaluate your child's illness and call you to



discuss your child's illness/injury and make an early excusal plan. I will always call you if your child wants to go home!
