

Introduction To Computer Networking

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Description:

This is an introductory class for students who are considering a career in communications and computer technology. Students will learn about the basic aspects of communications, computer, and technology integration. During the course of the class, various career fields are discussed and give students a greater understanding of the career field and what career paths exist.
